Our Centre receives funding from the Ministry of Education to support the provision of high-quality education and care for your child. This funding contributes to the operational costs of the centre, including staff wages, resources, and maintenance to ensure a safe and nurturing learning environment.

Statement of Service Performance

Treasured Tamariki Foundation Limited For the year ended 31 March 2025

Description of medium to long term objectives

Connecting (Tühonohono): We aim to strengthen our support for families in our community by honoring our bi-cultural identity and embracing the cultural diversity of our migrant families. We believe that recognising each child's cultural background is vital to their identity and self-esteem.

Collaborating (Mahi Ngātahi): We prioritise building strong relationships with Tamariki and their whānau. Our goal is to ensure that our educators, through continuous training and support, actively engage with families to understand and meet the unique aspirations of each child.

Caring & Support (Manaaki/Tautoko): We are committed to fostering the holistic development of every child—emotionally, socially, intellectually, and physically. Our curriculum is designed to promote comprehensive growth, providing a nurturing environment that encourages a sense of belonging and positive development.

Through these objectives, we are dedicated to fostering a nurturing and enriching environment for our Tamariki and their families.

Description and Quantification of the Entity's Key Activities

Description of Quantifiable Key Activity 1:

Description: Treasured Tamariki provides high-quality, licensed early childhood education and care, guided by Te Wháriki, for tamariki aged 0-6.

Quantification: In the period, we received \$76,096 in Ministry of Education funding and \$13,465 in parent fees to support the delivery of education and care. This reflects an average roll of 20 children per week and approximately 6,799 funded child hours provided.

Description of Quantifiable Key Activity 2:

Description: We deliver wrap around care for tamariki and their whanau, including additional wellbeing initiatives that support families facing hardship.

Quantification: In this reporting period, we received \$47,905 in donations and, which contributed directly to the delivery of wellbeing resources and supports for children and families.

Description and Quantification of the Entity's Activities

Description of Activities:

During this reporting period, Treasured Tamariki Foundation Limited (TTFL) successfully achieved charitable status and secured premises for a new Early Childhood Education (ECE) and Childcare Centre in Brookfield. Key milestones included designing a logo, updating our website with Treasured Tamariki information, and obtaining Network Approval from the Ministry of Education, marking an important step in establishing the centre.

In addition to these foundational achievements, TTFL recruited qualified teaching and support staff, enabling the centre to open and begin delivering services. We commenced enrolments with 9 children, growing steadily to 20 children, reflecting the increasing demand for our care and education services.

Quantification of Activities:

- Achieved charitable status and obtained Ministry of Education Network Approval.
- Secured premises for the ECE centre and launched Treasured Tamariki branding/website.
- Hired 4 qualified teachers and 6 support staff to deliver care and education.
- Commenced operations with 9 children enrolled, growing to 20 children during the reporting period.

Additional Activity Measures

During the reporting period, Treasured Tamariki maintained its licensed capacity of 20 child places (with an application lodged to increase capacity), growing enrolments from 9 to 20 children while consistently meeting. Ministry of Education staff to child ratios. We employed a team of qualified teachers and support staff, operating as an Extended Pay Parity Centre to ensure equitable remuneration. All qualified teachers participated in professional development and received mentorship support to strengthen their practice. Alongside this, we built meaningful connections with local community groups to enrich children's learning and provided wraparound support for whanau, including referrals to external services and tailored strategies for children with additional needs.

Basis of Preparation

The entity is permitted by law to apply the Tier 3 (NFP) Standard issued by the External Reporting Board (XRB) and has elected to do so.
